DIXIE SPRINGS YEAR IN REVIEW

I hope everyone had a great Christmas season! I thought it would be interesting to see the changes in Dixie Springs over the last year. I started providing a count of the lots that have houses or building permits sent to the City Of Hurricane in the Jan 2016. newsletter The number is larger than I thought. 184 homes in one year!

Dixie Springs accounts for between 1/4 to 1/2 of all the building permits in Hurricane, depending on the 2 week time period. That means we are a major driving force in the growth in Hurricane. This will hopefully allow us to have some influence in the City Council. I am watching the city council agenda topics and there have been many requests for new housing developments in Hurricane. The city is changing quickly and will no longer be a sleepy little town. Those changes have brought crime into Dixie Springs. There have been a number of cars and homes broken into so lock everything up. I am hoping the crime goes down once the building slows down.

WATER TANKS

There are two new water tanks planned for the Dixie Springs area.

Tank I. Off 3500S up the hill across from the farm. This is north of Dixie Springs and should not affect our homes or views. The permits for the land for this tank and access have been acquired and therefore it is all set to be installed.

Tank 2. This tank is proposed to be east of the corner of 2490 S and 3200 W on the top of the hill. The City needs to purchase a Dixie Springs lot so they can

build a road to the top of the hill. The tank would be accessed from Dixie Springs roads. This tank may be visible from Dixie Springs depending on where it is placed on the hill. The purchase of the lot has to occur before the tank can be built.

DIXIE SPRINGS COMMUNITY FUND

I have established a Dixie Springs Community Fund. The fund would be used for the following:

- Fight threats to our residential community by establishing a relationship with a lawyer who can provide council and other representation
- Fund the Dixie Springs Community Web Site
- Fund the email messages (free now but there is a cost once we get to a certain size).

No funds would be used without approval of a committee of community members.

The fund will **not** be used to enforce CC&RS.

The money for the fund would come from voluntary donations. We recommend \$100 per year per home,

but any amount is welcome. Any use of the money will be reported in the newsletter. We need to start building the fund now. If we are forced into a lawsuit, the cost could well be over \$20K.

To contribute to the fund, put your donation into the following account at the Mountain America Credit Union: 9992856. Put your name and lot number or address as a memo on the deposit so I can credit you with the donation.

You could set up a \$10 a month automatic deposit into the account, if that would be easier.

Please help your community. You may not be impacted by some of the threats now, but you may be in the future and will be glad of the support of your neighbors and the fund. Let's all work together!
