CARS BURGLARIZED IN DIXIE SPRINGS

None of the vehicles were locked, and several had the keys left in them, including the one stolen. The stolen vehicle was recovered. To protect your vehicles, you need to roll up your windows, remove

your keys, remove all valuables, and lock your vehicle.

There are a lot of strange people in the neighborhood because of the nightly rentals, and also all of the building going on. This means there are a lot of non-residents driving in our neighborhood.

LAKE POWELL PIPELINE UPDATE

There has been no feedback from Joshua Palmer from the Utah Division of Water Resources.

The southwest is currently in a persistent drought. The drought has hit the Colorado River hard. The river will only carry 43 percent f its average amount of water into Lake Powell. Southwest Utah is at 30 percent of normal for snow water level.

The Virgin River was expected to see flows at about 25 percent of normal this spring, although most residents in Washington County shouldn't see any restrictions or problems because there is adequate reservoir storage.

In many parts of the state, reservoir reserves are still depleted after extended drought conditions from 2012 to 2016, but the two largest in Washington

County were still mostly full.

As of Tuesday, the Washington County Water Conservancy District reported Sand Hollow Reservoir, the largest, was 96 percent full and Quail Creek Reservoir, the second-largest, was 78 percent full.

Representatives of the Washington County Water Conservatory District say the pipeline needs to be operational before the end of the 2020s, in order to keep up with the growing St. George population and the projected demand for water in the area.

Water is the biggest issue with the growth in the area. However, there are questions about how much water will be in Lake Powell given the drought. Unfortunately, local governments will not talk about the restriction of growth to ensure there is enough water.

- Fund the Dixie Springs Community Web Site
- Fund the email messages (free now but there is a cost once we get to a certain size).

No funds would be used without approval of a committee of community members.

The fund will **not** be used to enforce CC&RS.

The money for the fund comes from voluntary donations. We recommend \$100 per year per home,

but any amount is welcome. Any use of the money will be reported in the newsletter.

You could set up a \$10 a month automatic deposit into the account, if that would be easier.
