HURRICANE PLANNING AND ZONING

5/9/2019 Minutes

The Cove Development was approved by the Hurricane City Council a few months back, and this approval required a zoning change. The project had to be moved because of issues with access across public land. The following discussion was about the original zoning change that was required. The development next to the area that was to be rezoned is suing the City of Hurricane:

"City Attorney Fay Reber explained there has been a litigation filed challenging the City Council's approval of the General Plan amendment. He mentioned litigation could take a few months to a year to be resolved. He stated it doesn't make sense to consider a zone change until the City knows the outcome of the litigation. He explained there is only a Public Hearing at Planning Commission so the public wouldn't have another chance for input so if they were heard tonight then they wouldn't heard again before the City Council reviews it. Chris Christensen motioned to table the public hearing regarding the Zone Change request on the Cove property and application 2019-ZC-08 until litigation has been resolved, seconded by Rebecca Bronemann. Motion passed unanimously."

5/22/2019 Minutes

"2. A request for a Zoning Map amendment on 107.659 acres located south of 3000 South and east of Sand Hollow Road from RA-1, Residential Agriculture one unit per acre to Extraction Industries Overlay. Cheryl Case asked what an extraction industries overlay entailed. Toni Foran explained there is a section in the city code for extraction industry overlay for areas that have gravel, road base or other minerals that the owners want to extract. She stated they have to provide a plan on the haul roads, how deep they want to excavate, lighting, dust, and noise. She mentioned one of the proposed parcels is in an area that is designated as Industrial on the General Plan but the other parcel is designated as agriculture. The owners believe they have materials that are worth extracting. She explained with this overlay zone so once they have extracted the materials it will return to the original zone."

The location for this change is 3000 S on the east side of Sand Hollow reservoir. Follow Sand Hollow Road around Sand Hollow up the hill on the east side. When it turns right, it becomes 3450 and then 3000 S. The change was discussed at the next meeting but the results have not been posted.

No funds would be used without approval of a committee of community members.

The fund will **not** be used to enforce CC&RS.

The money for the fund comes from voluntary donations. We recommend \$100 per year per home,

but any amount is welcome. Any use of the money will be reported in the newsletter.
